In line with some historians, about 3,000 years in the past, Indian vastu practitioners (sometimes monks) crossed by means of Tibet and into China. The Chinese adopted and adapted Vastu principles, which advanced into the assorted colleges of feng shui.C. Most scholars agree that feng shui originated as a way of burial that advanced over time. There is even some evidence of feng shui rules in prehistoric Europe – Stonehenge, for example.
