The Google Local Ranking Criteria

Prominence, relevance distance and proximity are the three most important elements Google says it uses in its algorithm to present results that best match the query of a user.

Prominence indicates how well-known an enterprise is online and offline. [Google evaluates](#) things like reviews, links, articles, as well as general recognition in the community.

Relevance refers to the degree to which a business listing matches that which the consumer is searching for. This is accomplished through proper categorization of information as well as accurate business information and pertinent content.

Distance is a measure of how close the business is located to the searcher's place of residence or to the address specified in their search query.

The Essential Element of Local SEO

Google Business Profile (Formerly Google My Business)

Google Business Profile (GBP) formerly Google My Business (GMB) is a free tool that allows businesses to create and control the details of their Google Business listing. These listings should represent the physical location where customers can visit.

A complete and accurate Google Business Profile is fundamental to local SEO success. Key elements include:

Complete business details (name Address, address, phone number)

Selection of Business Category

NAP Consistency (Name, Address, Phone Number)

The primary factors that affect the likelihood of a local business appearing in local search are proper categorization within business directories, a company's address, name, and the phone number (NAP) being accessible on the website and references (mentions to the local business's location on other relevant websites, such as chamber of commerce's websites).

Congruity across all platforms is essential. Any discrepancies in your business name address, address, or telephone number could confuse the search engines, which can hurt your local rankings.

Mobile Optimized The majority of the local searches being conducted on mobile devices, having mobile-friendly websites is crucial for local SEO achievement.
