A useful first step is understanding the situation clearly. Employees may need to collect documents, review emails, write down dates and keep records of meetings or conversations. These details can help when discussing the matter and deciding what action may be appropriate. Workplace legal guidance can be helpful before a problem becomes more serious. Someone facing redundancy may want to understand consultation, notice, [payments](#) and possible options. A staff grievance may also need to be written carefully so the concern is explained in a clear and organized way.
